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Philosophy and Approach: I believe that everyone has strengths and abilities that we can access to help us reach our goals. Within a supportive environment we are often provided opportunities to grow and heal. My goal is to attend to each client's needs with a holistic view and provide a safe, confidential space in which to work. I believe in tailoring my approach to fit the needs of each client, and sessions can be a blend of several approaches. My work is influenced by psychodynamic theories, and I am trained in modalities that use acceptance and mindfulness; Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT), Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT), and Mindfulness-Based Stress Reduction (MBSR). My work is client-centered, strengths-based, and often solution focused. I work with the individual and in groups using art therapy as a means of expression and deeper exploration.

As a registered intern (R3599) of the Oregon Board of Licensed Professional Counselors I will abide by its Code of Ethics. I am under the ongoing supervision of Samuel Chi Baker MS, LPC License C1833, which I will be happy to explain.

Credentials and Training: My undergraduate training was at Warner Pacific College and I hold a Bachelor's Degree in Human Development. I have earned my certification in drug and alcohol counseling (CADCI). I earned a Master of Arts in Art Therapy Counseling (ATR) from Marylhurst University. I also participate biweekly in clinical supervision.

Fees: Sessions are \$85 per hourly session. I offer several sliding scale slots, so please inquire regarding availability if this is not manageable.
